Power to the People: Patient Education for Advance Care Planning



Background

A northern plains health care system encompassing a 300,000 square mile footprint, embraced an initiative to have 50% of adults place an advance care plan on record by July 2018. The initiative included:

- Adopting a single simplified version of an Advanced Care Plan (ACP) form for approved use in several states.
- Promotion of ACP in primary care offices.
- Training facilitators to assist people in community classes or individually in primary care clinics or hospitals.



A comprehensive guide was needed for use by both the health care team and persons interested in pursuing advance care planning for use across the entire health

- Patients received several loose resources to use while creating an advance care plan.
- Facilitators identified a need for more information about medical options for end-of-life care and requested a more streamlined way to present the material.

Goals

As part of the larger initiative, Patient Education will:

- Empower patients to create an Advance Care Plan by:

 Creating educational materials which better inform
- Creating educational materials which better inforpatients about end-of-life health care options.
- Encouraging patients to fill out an Advance Care Plan form by making it readily available.
- Support organizational standards by providing materials that are:
 - · Easy-to-read.
 - Affordable as a print resource.
 - Accessible as a web resource.

Methods

- A work team met via Skype and communicated by email between meetings.
- Identified barriers and potential solutions for successful ACP completion.
 - Increased font size to make easier to read.
 - Included ACP form within the book instead of as a separate piece.
- Provided more health information after receiving feedback from ACP classes.
- Evaluated class curricula and materials from all regions, looking for commonalities and opportunities to standardize written materials.
- Collaborated with Marketing to make the book attractive and inclusive to varied populations.

Results

An ACP booklet was designed to be used in a classroom, in a one-to-one appointment, or be self-directed. The topics covered are shown in the table of contents below.









Conclusion

The Advance Care Planning booklet has achieved the quadruple aim in these ways:

- Patient satisfaction is enhanced as the booklet empowers them to convey their wishes for end-of-life care.
- Clinical outcomes are strengthened as interventions reflect the person's wishes for end-of-life care as noted in the ACP booklet.
- Staff has easy access to a complete document. Increased satisfaction and decreased moral distress has been realized in their efforts to support the person's wishes.
- Health care costs are decreased when wishes are clearly outlined in the document.
 Additionally, the ACP booklet can be provided at a cost of less than a dollar.

Overall ACP Education Plan

- Promote ACP conversations in primary care by developing a CBT for providers
- Train facilitators to assist people in community classes or individually in primary care clinics
- Create an ACP form and booklet that includes instructions for use throughout the enterprise

Need for New Materials Identified

Facilitators in each region identified challenges in filling out the ACP

- ACP forms varied from state to state
- Supportive materials varied
- Patients received several resources to use while creating an ACP
- Patients asked for more treatment option information


