- What does your institution want?




Someone Has a Bright Idea

- Choose one to try

- What is the price of not doing it?
- What is the price of doing it
- Give options
- Can someone else do it?
- Having patient advisors can help

What does your institution want?

- You will never know until you ask
- It is better to ask than sell
- You might be surprised!

- Specific geographic area




What outcomes do you want? Who cares?


Determine the Content

- Base on patient-perceived problems
- Will content lead to outcomes?
- Need to know vs. nice to know
- Skills vs. content
- If you want empowerment, you must be empowering



A Word About Self-Efficacy *Patient Empowerment*

SE is the belief that one can accomplish a specific behavior. It is a good predictor of actual accomplishment.





How to Enhance Self-Efficacy

- Modeling
- Skills Mastery
- Reinterpretation
- Social Persuasion
